

Guardisman Captures Kudos at College Press Competition

The **Guardisman** is one of the state's top community college newspapers, at least according to the Journalism Association of Community Colleges (JACC) that recently awarded the publication several awards during its annual convention.

The bi-weekly campus tabloid earned General Excellence honors at the JACC State Convention held Apr. 4-7 in Sacramento.

The convention drew 50 community colleges and nearly 600 students to the annual gathering of student journalists and faculty advisors. **The Guardisman** delegation included students

Jonathan Villar, Meegan Rivera, Hung Van Lam, Doria Mueller, Adrian Varnedoe, and Mauricio Matusiak, as well as faculty advisor Juan Gonzales.

"**The Guardisman** held it's own by taking home 17 awards," said Gonzales. "In addition to the newspaper earning General Excellence honors, some of our reporters and photographers took home individual awards as well."

Mueller also won an Honorable Mention in Feature Photo and for Inside Page Design. In addition, Kevin Hitchcock captured two Honorable Mention awards in Bring-In Photo competition, Mark Clarin took First Place honors in

Advertisement and an Honorable Mention for Inside Page Design, Vince Jubilo won Third Place in Magazine Photo, while Gabe Ryan captured Second Place in Critical Review and Lucas Muncal won First Place honors for Investigative News Story. **The Guardisman** also took Third Place for Headline Writing and Honorable Mention in Staff Editorial competition.

"This is my second time going to the state convention, but it is the first time I got an award. It was cool to hear my name called when we won," said **Guardisman** Managing Editor Villar, who together with Mueller won third place in the On-The-Spot Team Feature category.
